Almighty God. It adds dignity, it adds dignity not only to that ceremony in the future but also to this document,

It is possible, if you will look at Delegate
Proposal No. 1, the four or five pages, it is very possible
that the only place that our dear Lord will be referred to
in this Constitution will be in these parentheses marks.

I don't think that we should deny Him completely in our Constitution.

There is plenty of religious history in this

State. We can start right with the foundation of the State
and the name of the State, the name of the first capital

of this State, the fact that the first Catholic diocese
was founded in this State. We could go on.

I would strongly suggest, Mr. Chairman, and
