THE PRESIDENT: I would suggest that your proper course is to move an amendment that the Convention adjourn until whatever hour you designate on whatever date you designate instead of 10 o'clock tomorrow.

DELEGATE VECERA: I therefore move that the Convention adjourn until after the election, if you want to meet tomorrow, until after the election, or the following day.

THE PRESIDENT: We can't do it on an "or". Will you make your motion one way or another?

DELEGATE VECERA: I would move that the Convention not convene tomorrow, rather it convene on Wednesday, the following day.

THE PRESIDENT: At what time?

DELEGATE VECERA: Ten a.m.

THE PRESIDENT: The motion is that the motion to adjourn until tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock a.m. be amended, to mean a motion to adjourn until 10 a.m. Wednesday morning. Is there a second?

(Whereupon, the motion was seconded.)
