with such things as the bicameral, unicameral issue, size of the legislature, the qualifications of people running for the legislature, salary compensation and other matters, and yet here we are tonight without the minority reports dealing with those subjects. I don't know how we can reconcile this, but I remember the Chairman of the Rules Committee at that time, unfortunately he is not here today. I remember his saying that if such printing difficulties did occur at the time, that it would be up to the President to postpone or we could take such other action to make sure that all the delegates had the minority reports in front of them before we took up these weighty questions. I do think, I think it is about time we start to temper our urgency to meet a schedule with consideration to what kind of product we are going to produce, and I think we can act too hastily, and at least the delegates ought to have the minority reports in front of them, at least a day in advance, before we take up these substantive matters.
