tomorrow, in order to electioneer or for whatever purposes you may want to pursue.

THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Vecera?

DELEGATE VECERA: Mr. President, in response
to Delegate Borom's suggestion, I don't think the issue should
be divided. I think it is all pertinent in that tomorrow
being an election day in Baltimore City, also that the
Committee of the Whole will be meeting on a very important,
significant matter for the legislature, and I think the question is all one, it should not be divided. It is for that
matter that I arose in the beginning. I think it is so
important a matter to be discussed that I would hate to
miss even one minute of it.

THE PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Delegate Chabot?

DELEGATE CHABOT: Mr. President, there are many times when people end up voting the same way on an issue for a variety of reasons. I think two reasons have been presented here for voting Aye to Delegate Vecera's motion, and I would hate to have the motion defeated simply because the people who consider one more important are reluc-
