of deliberation that we would like to take an hour or two or three-hour recess, could we not do that in order to get the committee reports back on the Floor tomorrow afternoon and resolve the whole thing?

DELEGATE POWERS: If we reach a point, in answer to the delegate's question, if we reach a point that we are considering matters that the delegates have not had opportunity to familiarize themselves with, there is certainly provision in the rules so that we may delay the proceedings and afford such an opportunity. We would contemplate that by the time the general orders had been reached, and in view of the ample opportunity that is afforded the committee chairman as well as representatives of the minority to present without limitation of time an explanation of any amendments, that there would not be such a situation as someone voting out of ignorance, but he would be very familiar with exactly what the situation was.
