1 THE PRESIDENT: I don't think the motion would 2 be in order at this time. If the present motion fails, you will be able to offer that as an amendment to the primary 3 4 motion. 5 DELEGATE BARD: I would really be interested and more concerned if the present motion passes. 6 THE PRESIDENT: The Parliamentarian thinks that the Chair could permit you to make the amendment either 8 way, either as a secondary amendment to the amendment now 9 10 pending or in the manner I indicated. 11 I would prefer to make it as DELEGATE BARD: a secondary or tertiary amendment whichever it may have to 12 13 be. THE PRESIDENT: St ate your amendment. 14 DELEGATE BARD: Mr. President, I move that we 15 convene tomorrow at 12 noon. 16 THE PRESIDENT: I take it that is a motion to 17 amend the amendment to the primary motion, to provide that 18 the Convention adjourn until noon tomorrow, Tuesday, 19 rather than 10 a.m. Wednesday. Is there a second? 20
