report. While the report has been distributed to the Convention, until it is formally offered by the Committee through me as its Chairman, it is really not before this Convention.

THE PRESIDENT: Mr. Scanlan, you didn't permit me to finish. I was going to say that the report is before the Convention. The action that the Convention takes with respect to the report depends upon the notions that are made. I will give you the opportunity to as and the motion that you did make. May I address an inquiry to Delegate White?

Did I understand you did prefer to have the various recommendations of the Committee considered separately?

DELEGATE WHITE: Yes, Mr. Chairman.

THE PRESIDENT: I don't know that this is absolutely necessary, but I think in the interest of orderly procedure, if any delegate desires to have the Convention consider each amendment separately, he is entitled to have that privilege; and therefore, we will take up each one separately.
