of the Calendar and Agenda Committee presents it.

Yesterday, in the Committee of the Whole, the question was asked whether or not the prior Constitutions of Maryland made any reference to God in the provision for the oath, and I indicated that a very quick glance at the copies of the four previous Constitutions indicated that in the oath section, there was no reference to God.

This was partially incorrect in that the 1776

Constitution in prescribing the oath does indeed not make any provision to God or any Supreme Being, but in the same section, following the provision for the oath, is a provision that the person taking the oath shall also subscribe a declaration of his belief in the Christian religion; similarly, the subsequent Constitutions did not make in the oath section itself any reference to a Supreme Being, but each of them in a provision in the Declaration of Rights did require in varying terms that elected officials indicate their belief in a Supreme Being.

I make this statement merely so that the record will be correct.
