

1 DELEGATE B. MILLER: Mr. President, I rise  
2 on a point of parliamentary inquiry. I would like to know  
3 whether it is possible to call for reconsideration of the  
4 amendment that we passed yesterday in the Committee of the  
5 Whole?

6 THE PRESIDENT: It would not be at this time.  
7 There will be an opportunity, of course, not for recon-  
8 sideration, but for the equivalent, new consideration of  
9 that, when the Committee recommendation is presented to  
10 the Convention on second reading. It will then be open  
11 for amendment. Delegate Miller?

12 DELEGATE B. MILLER: There is no reconsideration  
13 of any action taken by the Committee of the Whole; is  
14 that correct?

15 THE PRESIDENT: No --

16 DELEGATE B. MILLER: On second reading?

17 THE PRESIDENT: I won't say that. On the con-  
18 trary, on the second reading, the Convention can consider  
19 anew an amendment which may be offered thereto, regardless
