2 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Gleason?

3 DELEGATE GLEASON: I appreciate those comments,
4 and with that understanding, I will vote to go along.

5 I think the difficulty that some of us have, of
6 course, is that we can't determine for ourselves ahead of
7 the fact just how many people are going to speak in connec-
8 tion with a particular manedment, but with that understand-
9 ing, I think we can operate from this point forward.

10 THE PRESIDENT: I think the Chair, before the
11 debate schedule is adopted, should also make clear two other
12 things: If you will look at the debate schedule, you will
13 see that it purports to control time for debate on a
14 limited number of subjects. This means that the time on
15 other questions is not controlled, except by the sentence
16 in the beginning portion, that no speech exceeding five
17 minutes will be permitted.

18 Now, what this means in practical application
19 is this: After the Committee Chairman presents his report,
20 and we have had the question and answer period, for which
21 there is no time limit, the Committee Chairman resumes his
