DELEGATE BAMBERGER: M r. Chairman, in the
uncontrolled time which follows the discussion by
the minority reports spokesmen or the Chairmen on the
various sections, may a Delegate speak to either a majority
report or the minority report without offering an amendment

to either of those reports?

DELEGATE POWERS: The answer to that is yes, he may, subject to a limitation of three minutes. He may speak favorably or unfavorably on the matter immediately before the Convention.

DELEGATE BAMBERGER: And what are those steps which you say can be taken to extend the uncontrolled time if it is necessary?

DELEGATE POWERS: If we reach the point where the uncontrolled time appears to be insufficient to give the Delegates a reasonable opportunity to present their point, we would move that the Committee of the Whole rise and report to the Convention that we desire to amend the debate schedule to permit further time.

DELEGATE BAMBERGER: I would address an inquiry to the Chair: Is there no way to accomplish that purpose
