

1 some might well be destroyed. Since, however, it
2 has sought for a responsible legislature, a legislature
3 easily observed and a responsibility explicitly imposed,
4 its by-product will, hopefully, be a concentration of public
5 attention upon the individual legislator..

6 The Committee would hope, therefore, that it
7 has fashioned a body where the opportunity to serve is
8 commensurate with the likelihood of being accurately evalu-
9 ated by the electorate on the basis of actual performance.

10 To be lost among large numbers, not to be
11 accountable for decisions, and to carry but a portion of the
12 responsibility to the electorate are evils which the
13 Committee sought to eliminate.

14 These are the reasons which impelled Committee
15 approval of what follows. These recommendations may
16 well not be what each of the 20 members of the Committee
17 would have preferred if he were the sole author of the
18 section, but the recommendations do represent what the
19 vast majority of the Committee agreed upon in the crucible
20 of the democratic process, and on that basis the Committee
21 report is presented.
