I would stress in taking up section 3.01, that is to say, the legislative power of the State is vested in the General Assembly, which shall consist of two houses, the Senate and the House of Delegates, that this particular section must be read in conjunction with the remainder of the recommendations. That is to say, I am suggesting to this Committee that the report which you have before you is a package, and was voted upon with the idea that it contained the elements throughout which made each and every section satisfactory to the majority of the members of the Committee.

The Committee heard 68 witnesses, of whom 31 were present or former members of the General Assembly, 11 were professionals in the field or authors and academicians -- I hesitate and do not use the word experts -- and 13 were legislative agents or lobbyists or fell into other categories.

In suggesting the adoption of a bicameral General Assembly, the Committee did not believe that we should depart from tradition or history. In each of the four Constitutions under which the State of Maryland has
