

1 minutiae and detail to the point where you could guarantee  
2 everyone who was discomodod as a result of redistricting  
3 ~~and had~~ <sup>an</sup> opportunity to run in more than one district so  
4 under some circumstances, and perhaps ideally it may  
5 represent 90 per cent of the time, if one finds one's self  
6 in a new district, one would have the choice between run-  
7 ning in that new district or your old district, providing  
8 that it has at least 50 per cent of the population of the  
9 old district.

10 By the way, it was the problem with respect to  
11 redistricting and reapportionment which caused the Legis-  
12 lative Committee to veer away from any serious consider-  
13 ation of staggered terms. In actuality, the suggestion  
14 of staggered terms met with a great deal of appeal <sup>by</sup> to the  
15 members of the Committee on the Legislative Branch, but the  
16 practical difficulties in deciding who gets staggered  
17 out and who gets staggered in, after every ten years, was  
18 just too much to try to overcome. Consequently, we, as you  
19 see later in the report, decided to go with four-year  
20 terms in both the House and the Senate.
