legislators, a member of the General Assembly shall be elected by the qualified voters of the legislative district from which he seeks election to serve for a term of four years, beginning on the second Wednesday of December following his election.

As I made allusion earlier, it had been the practice in Maryland for many years to stagger the Senate terms. We also had had some experience with two-year House terms, but we have found in the little over the decade that we had the four-year term that it has served quite well in both the House and the Senate. One of the great difficulties in imposing a two-year term upon the lower House or any house as far as that is concerned is that the members are always running for reelection, as is the case with the Congressmen of the United States in the House of Representatives, so the Committee felt that there should be some period of time during which members of the General Assembly should not have to worry about the business of campaigning, and the four-year term for both House and Senate was adopted. It seemed quite attractive. I might say that Maryland shares the distinction of using the
