session the following year. The 30 day session presumably was to take care of budget matters, emergency legislation, and matters pertaining to the general welfare. This presented such great problems, however, that the General Assembly ultimately moved to regular 70 day annual sessions.

Twenty-one States of the States of the Union meet annually, and there is a great movement in the direction of annual meetings.

I might also say that 43 States of the Union begin their regular sessions in January, as has been suggested in 3.12.

Now, it may be quite true that the reason for commencement of sessions in January had something to do with the harvesting of crops and the availability of the farmers when the State was primarily a rural State, rather than moving in the direction of an urban State; but nevertheless, the January time is ideal from many points of view. The fiscal year is built around this particular meeting time, and consequently the Committee felt that we should continue to provide for the regular meeting the third Wednesday of January, although you may see
