We have arrived at the figure of \$8,000, and I believe and the members of the Committee believe, conservatively, based upon very detailed sifting of the duties of the members of the General Assembly. We believe that the off-session Committee work, as well as the 70 day work which is presently performed by the General Assembly takes up so much time of some of the Delegates that although we may be reluctant to classify the General Assembly of Maryland as a full time legislature, that nevertheless it approaches full time service to the people of Maryland in the amount of time that is devoted to the business of this State and to the business of the General Assembly.

Now, it may well be true that in past times it has been difficult to have the voters increase the Constitutionally authorized salary, but the Committee believes that part of the reason lies in the fact that the general public is not aware of the vast amount of time and sacrifice that goes into being a member of the General Assembly. An examination of the salaries paid in other States will indicate that in recommending a figure of \$8,000, we err
