2 DELEGATE CASE: I wonder if you would explain
3 to me, because this mystifies me a little bit, just
4 precisely how this would work.

5 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Well, of course, the Consti-
6 tution does not seek to do the redistricting. All we have
7 done in this report is to take the 35-105 figures, determine
8 what the state population would be per one-thirty-fifth
9 and one-one hundred and fifth, and on the basis of
10 35-105 allocate the House and Senate seats on a per county
11 or political subdivision basis.

12 DELEGATE CASE: Obviously this does not mean
13 that Calvert County will have one-fifth of the Senate.

14 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: No.

15 DELEGATE CASE: That would be pretty hard to do.

16 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes.

17 DELEGATE CASE: Even in Calvert County.

18 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: The mathematicians would
19 be required to put together districts which would assumedly
20 have one full House district, and then having three of
21 those, the corresponding Senate district.
