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fifth.

DELEGATE CASE: I wonder if you would explain to me, because this mystifies me a little bit, just precisely how this would work.

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Well, of course, the Constitution does not seek to do the redistricting. All we have done in this report is to take the 35-105 figures, determine what the state population would be per one-thirty-fifth and one-one hundred and fifth, and on the basis of 35-105 allocate the House and Senate seats on a per county or political subdivision basis.

DELEGATE CASE: Obviously this does not mean that Calvert County will have one-fifth of the Senate.

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: No.

DELEGATE CASE: That would be pretty hard to do.

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes.

DELEGATE CASE: Even in Calvert County.

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: The mathematicians would be required to put together districts which would assumedly have one full House district, and then having three of those, the corresponding Senate district.
