

1 THE CHAIRMAN: He deemed it to be an answer,
2 I take it.

3 DELEGATE CASE: The question was, and I will
4 repeat it, can you tell us or give us any county or the
5 City which would not have its lines obliterated for these
6 purposes in at least one instance.

7 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: I do not like "obliteration"
8 but if we agree, we are not using that term. I will say
9 that it would be possible for me to draw a redistricting plan
10 which would accomplish the non-obliteration of at least
11 one county or one city district.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Fox.

13 DELEGATE FOX: Mr. Chairman, looking at page 2
14 of the committee's recommendation, the latter part of
15 Section 3.04, the top of page 2, line 2, where it says
16 each delegate shall represent one delegate district and each
17 senator shall represent one Senate district, would that
18 not prevent a delegate from being elected in more than
19 one delegate district?

20 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: I would say it would have
21 that felicitous effect.
