THE CHAIRMAN: He deemed it to be an answer,

I take it.

DELEGATE CASE: The question was, and I will repeat it, can you tell us or give us any county or the City which would not have its lines obliterated for these purposes in at least one instance.

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: I do not like "obliteration" but if we agree, we are not using that term. I will say that it would be possible for me to draw a redistricting plam which would accomplish the non-obliteration of at least one county or one city district.

THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Fox.

of the committee's recommendation, the latter part of
Section 3.04, the top of page 2, line 2, where it says
each delegate shall represent one delegate district and each
senator shall represent one Senate district, would that
not prevent a delegate from being elected in more than
one delegate district?

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: I would say it would have that felicitous effect.
