3 matters needed to qualify to vote, then the person must
4 have been registered to vote?

5 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes. I would believe that to be
6 the interpretation.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Chabot?

8 DELEGATE CHABOT: Sections 3.06 and 3.12 would
9 make significant changes -- well, 3.12 a significant change,
10 and 3.06 a small change with regard to the legislature.

11 Is it intended that those sections would take
12 effect with regard to the present legislature?

13 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes, it would.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Hardwicke?

15 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Of course, there would
16 be no organization session in the ordinary sense of the
17 word as far as I can see.

18 DELEGATE HARDWICKE: Mr. Chairman, the question
19 that I have relates to the interdependence of the various
20 features of the committee's report, and specifically I
21 would like to have a comment on whether the committee would
have felt the same way about bicameralism if all of the
