some discussion on that point in the Suffrage and Elections Committee, that if registration is one of the matters needed to qualify to vote, then the person must have been registered to vote?

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes. I would believe that to be the interpretation.

THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Chabot?

DELEGATE CHABOT: Sections 3.06 and 3.12 would make significant changes -- well, 3.12 a significant change, and 3.06 a small change with regard to the legislature.

Is it intended that those sections would take effect with regard to the present legislature?

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes, it would.

THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Hardwicke?

DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Of course, there would be no organization session in the ordinary sense of the word as far as I can see.

DELEGATE HARDWICKE: Mr. Chairman, the question that I have relates to the interdependence of the various features of the committee's report, and specifically I would like to have a comment on whether the committee would have felt the same way about bicameralism if all of the
