2 In other words, may I ask you whether or not the recommenda-
3 tion for bicameralism is not predicated upon, first,
4 your recommendation that the size of both Houses be
5 decreased, and second, the belief that if you have the new
6 legislature, it will reform itself to some extent by spread-
7 ing the committee load, et cetera, and I suppose to pin-
8 point this question, may I ask you, sir, whether or not if
9 these reforms are not adopted, or if we do not reduce the
10 size considerably, is your committee still in favor of bi-
11 cameralism?

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Gallagher?

13 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: First of all, I want to
14 thank you for characterizing the document as one that
15 seeks reform. I would say to the best of my ability that the
16 committee was in an agreeable frame of mind about bicameralism
17 because of these other features.

18 I would not on any given day, indeed at any
19 given hour, suggest to you what the exact vote on bicameralism
20 or unicameralism would be if some of these significant
21 features were eliminated.
