

1 Are these people going to be senators or delegates?

2 DELEGATE HANSON: I am reasonably indifferent  
3 to what they are called constitutionally if we assemble  
4 them together in one House. I would be most happy to submit  
5 to a title of great distinction which this convention  
6 might confer on the members of that House.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Are there any further questions?

9 DELEGATE CHABOT: Would you feel that the responsi-  
10 bility of the legislature which you suggest would be enhanced  
11 by making unicameral rather than bicameral would be further  
12 enhanced by eliminating the gubernatorial veto?

13 DELEGATE HANSON: No, I do not think so. The  
14 power of the legislature undoubtedly would be enhanced by  
15 elimination of the gubernatorial veto but it seems to me  
16 that in a government of divided powers that there is a need  
17 for a certain amount of creative friction between the  
18 executive and legislative branches of the government and  
19 that both the legislature and the executive ought to  
20 participate in the policy-making process and the existence  
21 of the veto as well as the existence of the power of
