focuses attention on the acts of each member of the legislature and holds him personally accountable to his constituency about the ability to diffuse that responsibility.

DELEGATE L. TAYLOR: Did you ask yourself this question, would a Senate body along with the House of Delegates, would that allow more flexibility in solving the regional problems?

DELEGATE HANSON: I do not know that we asked ourselves that question specifically, no.

THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Hanson, I think

Delegate Taylor's questions were designed to ask whether

or not a delegation from a region could be more effective

in handling regional problems in the legislature in

the unicameral legislature or bicameral legislature.

DELEGATE HANSON: I think to that question I would answer that I believe that a delegation in a unicameral body would be more effective in any given circumstance in handling a problem, whether a regional problem or any other kind of substantive problem than a bicameral delegation would be, primarily because it would not be possible to shift responsibility for the action they took or
