

1 supported unicameralism. The Washington Post has suggested
2 that perhaps unicameralism is too daring for this convention.
3 I suggest that it is not daring, but a necessity that requires
4 unicameralism.

7 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Mr. Chairman, I yield for
8 three minutes to Delegate Malkus.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Malkus?

10 DELEGATE MALKUS: Mr. President, ladies and
11 gentlemen of the Constitutional Convention, we had numerous
12 witnesses before the Committee on the Legislative Branch
13 cover just about everybody that knows anything about the
14 General Assembly of Maryland. The vote for bicameralism
15 was 33. The vote for unicameralism was 11.

16 Now, of these, of the 11, five were out-of-state
17 people.
