

1 the legislators and the people.

2 Because of pure legislators, no duplication
3 of committees and a simple process, the citizens would learn
4 more about the legislative procedures, and this would enable
5 them to judge more adequately persons and issues.

6 This direct and often personal experience would
7 cause them to trust their fellow man and have more confidence
8 in decisions.

9 Unicameralism would particularly benefit the
10 minority and ethnic groups and individual citizens because
11 the responsibility and blame for actions taken or not taken
12 on bills could be clearly fixed. Minority groups who have
13 had long histories of unfulfilled promises and buck-passing,
14 which has resulted in many frustrations, disillusionment
15 and disappointments should welcome the opportunity of a
16 unicameral legislature so that they would know who are and
17 who are not living up to their promises, and could then
18 react appropriately at the right time.

19 The smaller number of legislators in a uni-
20 cameral chamber should result in higher caliber of persons
21 selected to represent the electorate, and that in itself
is far more important than any particular number.
