

1 Is there any, or do you have any comments with reference  
2 to the desirability of one against the other?

3 DELEGATE JAMES: I didn't come here to flail  
4 the majority report, which I think is a reasonably good  
5 one. I simply feel that an 80 man house is a more manage-  
6 able type of house. It would enable you to do, to compen-  
7 sate better. It would give you a better committee struc-  
8 ture. It seems to me an 80 man house is better from the  
9 standpoint of freedom of debate. This is a very important  
10 point.

11 In the Senate we don't have the motion for the  
12 previous question. We have full freedom of debate. When  
13 you get a house which is too large, you must of necessity  
14 curtail your freedom of debate. I think any legislative  
15 body which has to curtail freedom of debate by the motion  
16 for the previous question lacks something.
