2 and the senate. It is the fact that certain people just
3 don't have the money to campaign.

4 DELEGATE JAMES: I find this is true.
5 It is a cynical fact of political life, I am sorry to say.

6 DELEGATE BENNETT: Would this amendment of yours
7 have any bearing on that, do you think?

8 DELEGATE JAMES: Well, in the senate it would
9 probably minimize or reduce the cost because, of course,
10 the 35 man senate, the district would have to be larger.
11 In the house -- because the district would be increased
12 in size, and the cost of running for a house district would
13 probably be increased, but I don't think, or I think
14 that either proposal really would probably reduce the
15 cost of running from the standpoint of house members.
