

1 I think we should take a look at what the ma-  
2 jority vote of the Legislative Branch Committee really  
3 represents as far as it sits before you here today. On  
4 page 7 of that majority report is the following language:

5 "The Committee adopted these limitations, 105  
6 and 35, by a vote of 15 to 4," and then it lists the members  
7 voting for the adoption by that margin.

8 I find, as I go through the list, that there are  
9 one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten  
10 of the fifteen who have already voted in this chamber in  
11 the last two days for an 80-40 house and senate or a uni-  
12 cameral legislature. Of the other five that were in the  
13 majority, I find three who are sending minority reports  
14 that are presently before you or coming before you, and  
15 of the remaining five or the remaining four who are listed  
16 in the minority report, those also are on the minority  
17 reports.

18 I think one factor is clear: There has been  
19 no unanimity in the Legislative Branch Committee about  
20 what the size of the legislature should be, and there  
21 certainly is no unanimity that that size shall be frozen
