

1 I don't think it is in the material that I have.

2 It is a little difficult since the reapportion-
3 ment to decide who in effect establishes size because,
4 like in Maryland, we had it in the legislature. The Con-
5 stitution did not do it. It could not do it. It was un-
6 constitutional. The legislature did it. They put out
7 two plans, and, of course, one of those was overturned by
8 the courts and the other was accepted.

9 Other States are in similar categories, so that
10 the material that I have doesn't meet the specific question
11 of the delegate.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Chabot.

13 DELEGATE CHABOT: Well, then, could you indicate
14 to us which are the States that clearly permit the size
15 to be established by the legislature, without a constitutional
16 intermission?

17 DELEGATE GLEASON: No, because the answer to the
18 last question covers this one as well. All I have is
19 the numbers. I don't have the States themselves.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Any other questions of the mi-
21 nority spokesman?
