10 mitted to rise in such a manner that each county's
11 population would be assured of not having to share a
12 delegate with another county, what the size of the House
13 of Delegates might be in 1970.

14 DELEGATE GLEASON: Well, let me say in answer
15 to that question, I don't think either the delegate or
16 myself knows, because we don't know where these population
17 increases are going to occur; so I can't tell. There has
18 been some evidence submitted by our research assistants to
19 the Committee that this House would go up in terms of 192
20 approximately by the 1970 census, by what I am saying, and
21 of course, it is the burden of our report, is that we
