4 THE CHAIRMAN: Are there any further questions?
5 Delegate Mason?

6 DELEGATE MASON: Delegate Gleason, I believe you
7 indicated that several States have reapportioned their
8 legislatures. I wonder if you have any record as to what
9 States were forced to reapportion because of court order
10 and what States voluntarily reapportioned.

11 DELEGATE GLEASON: I would defer you to the
12 great expert on this, Mr. Scanlan, and Mr. Hanson. I do
13 not have that information.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Scanlan?

15 DELEGATE SCANLAN: Very, very few have re-
16 apportioned without either under the impact of a direct
17 court order or under the threat of an order in the wind.
18 Several, New Jersey being one, and I think one other
19 State, went ahead and did reapportion before the flood of
20 reapportionment decisions. By the way, I didn't foster
21 the decision, Mr. Gleason. I merely argued it.
