

1 DELEGATE GLEASON: Yes. Well, when you say
2 statistics on reduction in size, statistics in reference
3 to what?

4 DELEGATE WILLONER: Have any legislatures reduced
5 their size?

6 DELEGATE GLEASON: Yes. There is some refer-
7 ence to the answer to that question in my remarks, and
8 nine States during this period of time have reduced the
9 size of their lower house; 75 per cent of that reduction
10 has occurred in two States, which had legislative sizes in
11 the lower house over two hundred. In the same period of
12 time, six States have increased the size of the lower
13 house. When you go to the Senate, the situation is that
14 three States have decreased the size of their Senate to a
15 total of eleven; and fifteen States have increased the
16 size to approximately a seventy-one total figure.
