

1 I suggest to you, sir, that we should have the
2 General Assembly not boxed in as they were boxed in under
3 the previous constitution.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Gallagher, you have two and
5 a half minutes you can allocate.

6 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: I will yield to Mr. Scanlan.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Scanlan.

8 DELEGATE SCANLAN: I believe Delegate Gallagher
9 is mistaken. Delegate Bamberger was to speak at this point.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Bamberger.

11 DELEGATE BAMBERGER: The issues before us are really
12 two: They are the issues of what shall be the proper size
13 of the General Assembly if it is to be efficient, if it is
14 to be strong, if it is to stand in its proper relationship
15 to the executive and to the judiciary.

16 The second issue, and the issue stressed before
17 out committee by the witnesses who are now members of the
18 General Assembly who appear before us, and by the seven
19 members of our committee who are present or former members
20 of the General Assembly, was to free us from the kind of
21 turmoil, the kind of rending trauma that we have when we
