13 I called them one time, Mr. President, sundowners
14 and moonlighters, and bedroom citizens, and the Washington
15 papers tore me to pieces, but as I look through this list
16 of business offices, just casually, of course, I found
17 eleven that are here in this body make their living in
18 Washington, D. C.

19 Mr. President, to us that come from the real, real,
20 real, rural sections, we not only live there, we work there,
21 we raise our families there and make our living there.
