

1 one of his heroes, Justice Holmes, yesterday he said
2 that the life of law is not object, it is experience.

3 We have heard in this body less than two months
4 of deliberations on the need of the composition of this
5 size of General Assembly. I earnestly urge you to let the
6 experience of the legislature guide you. Conscientious
7 legislators will not shirk their duties, and I have more
8 faith in the elected representatives of the people
9 than evidently those who say that the legislature will
10 grow so large the halls will not hold them.

11 I don't agree with this. We who are about
12 to be obliterated support your amendment.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Chabot, you have one-
15 half minute to speak against the amendment.

16 DELEGATE CHABOT: One-half minute isn't very
17 much time. I am one of the overflow that Delegate Malkus
18 spoke about.

19 The one-man/one-vote question has been brought
20 up here. I understand that there will be another part
21 of the Constitution dealing with that matter.
