2 for the purpose of efficiency, you are going to cut us  
3 out of the picture. When you got one-man, one-vote, what we  
4 are trying to do for the time being--we do not know what  
5 is going to happen, what the population movement is going  
6 to be. A long time ago in England, when the Parliament first  
7 came into being, it talked about communities of interest,  
8 people of a certain interest having some representation.  
9 That is what we are fighting for. We are, as you know, succes-  
10 sors to the English Parliament. We are fighting for some  
11 representation in this General Assembly. One man, one vote.  
12 Let me tell you one thing. I have said this in the committee.  
13 Somebody reminded me I forgot to say this this morning.  
14 You city people are going to have a hard time eating  
15 bricks and cement.

17           You may laugh. Very true. You may laugh. But  
18 I represent one of those small groups that still feed you  
19 folks and I hope to keep on doing it, Mr. President. But  
20 when you cut us down to the bare bones, you are cutting us  
21 out of consideration almost completely.
