

1 unthinkable that in remedying one inescapable situation
2 we will leave about one-third of our counties without
3 representation in a foreseeable time. I do not know that
4 the bill on the floor is an answer. I certainly doubt that
5 it is an answer. But I make this as a general statement
6 that I do not think we can, while this is a part of
7 our responsibility, I do not think in curing one evil
8 we dare to go home creating and leaving the other in existence.

12 DELEGATE GILCHRIST: Thank you, Mr. President.
13 I should like to comment only on a couple of things mentioned
14 in the course of the debate. One is the mention of
15 the warfare between the House and the Senate. I suggest there
16 is no more warfare inherent in this proposal than in the
17 other. In fact, I suggest that cutting to 105 produces
18 far more warfare than this.
