

1 that all sessions of the Convention and of its committees
2 should be open to the public. In keeping with this principle
3 and in accordance with therequirements of Section 14 of
4 the Convention Enabling Act, we plan to provide not merely a
5 public relations office, but an information service which we
6 hope will, as its name implies, furnish complete information
7 service not only to the press and other news media, but also
8 to visitors and to the public generally.

9 This information service will be housed in one
10 corner of the large room used by the Department of Legisla-
11 tive Reference during sessions of the General Assembly and
12 will be freely accessible to the public at all times.
13 A card index showing the current status of every proposal
14 pending before the Convention and each of its committees will
15 be maintained and the information service will at all times have
16 on hand readily available a copy of every Delegate proposal,
17 committee recommendation, or other document prepared for use
18 of Delegates or distributed to them.

19 The information service will be staffed by persons
20 whose duty it will be not merely to prepare formal press
21 releases or other public information buleetins, but to
