2 the allocation of time is extremely important and it will
3 be helpful for us all to know when that time comes and
4 be familiar with the procedure so that it may be followed
5 when it becomes very important.

6 I move the adoption of the report of the
7 Committee on Calendar and Agenda which is on the desks
8 of all of us.

9 THE PRESIDENT: Is there a second? It is
10 moved that the calendar and agenda on the desks of all
11 delegates be adopted as the calendar for today. All those
12 in favor signify by saying Aye; contrary, No. So ordered.

13 The next item on the calendar is introduction
14 and first reading of proposals.

15 I might say before reading the proposals that
16 I understand that all proposals up until those to be
17 introduced today, with the exception of No. 55, introduced
18 yesterday, are either in your books or on your desks.
