2 the personal privilege?

3 DELEGATE HARRY TAYLOR: A funny thing happened
4 to me on the way to the Senate, or actually in the Senate
5 Chamber yesterday after the meeting adjourned. I was
6 in there to listen to the session on Personal Rights
7 and The Preamble of the Constitution, and I took with
8 me one of my most valuable possessions. That was the
9 final report of the Constitutional Convention Commission,
10 which I believe before this session is over will probably
11 become a bible of the Convention. I put it on a desk
12 in the Senate, and I moved from that desk to better ob-
13 serve and hear the witnesses; and shortly thereafter, I
14 turned and my bible was gone. The session was on civil
15 rights, and I hope that whoever did take this off the
16 desk will give equal time to property rights, because
17 these volumes are not yet available in great supply. I
18 understand they will be available starting Monday of
19 next week, but I think it is a tool that I need very
20 badly. I would like to have it returned.
