DELEGATE SICKLES: Delegate Moser, with respect
to Section 7.03, which concerns itself with structure of
government, do I understand this section correctly when
I conclude that as a matter of establishing procedures
for the operation of the county government, the state
can only do it one time through the authority the General
Assembly would have to provide an instrument of government
effective July 1, 1972?

That would of course also apply to those counties who have not adopted an instrument of government by that time and even that one could be amended thereafter under procedures established in 7.04.

My conclusion as I read this, I would hope you would show me otherwise if I am wrong, that as a matter of fact then the state would be forever precluded from establishing standards that have to do with the structure and administration of the county government rather than the powers it might have.

DELEGATE MOSER: Let me answer the last question first. The answer to the last suggestion is no, that the state can always act by general law to affect all
