understand it, to a statewide referendum. Under what has been before us in the Committee of the Whole up to now, it would not be subject to a local referendum as a law of the General Assembly locally referred as provided by what is it, Article 13 of the present Constitution, whatever it happens to be. I hope I am not saying here we go again, but let me continue with it.

It is an enabling law. It is not an affirmative act. It is not therefore effective in doing anything that is this local option arrangement, not effective in doing anything until the county acts. When the county acts its charter would provide for local referendum
