The General Assembly can give additional powers to new municipalities as well as to old. This means, for instance, they can make darned sure if a municipality is created by a county it will not be an odd beast, limited in what it can do.

They could, for instance say, I believe,
a new municipality, if the county creates it, has to have
home rule. I would expect them to have the same procedures
for both. That is not true of a civil unit. A civil
unit, as we envision it, is something totally dominated
by the county, under the county, a creature of the county
entirely. What it is is a convenient way for the
county to provide a focal point where there is a population
concentration, give sewer and water in that area.

Some of the less developed counties are going to need this kind of thing. It could also provide a forum, if handled properly by the county, for them to express themselves.

THE CHAIRMAN: Apparently there are more questions

I do not want to ask the Committee to rise and go through
the procedure of having a quorum call again.
