just want to know, when they say they speak for a group or an association, that they truly do, and for whom they speak. I think this is a little bit different than the situation in the General Assembly. The category of representative witnesses, as we call the latter category, those who don't get paid, will be very large indeed.

Then let's get to the question of the persons purported to be covered by this regulation. We purport to cover every person who is engaged to represent another person, association, corporation, et cetera, as set forth in Section 1(a), who receives compensation for those efforts. That category of person must register as an agent; whether or not he is just talking to a delegate or writing a delegate or what have you. The second category, category we have elected to call representative witnesses, are those who don't, who are not compensated for their efforts in advocating the views of others, but who nevertheless advocate the views of others.
