THE PRESIDENT: Technically I think probably the motion to approve the resolution ought to be before you first, but I don't think there is any objection and the Chair will rule that in the absence of objection, any objection, the stylistic amendment just suggested by the committee will be made. Is there any objection at all?

THE PRESIDENT: Hearing none, the resolution is amended so as to substitute for the word resolution wherever it appears in the body of the proposal, the word "regulation."

DELEGATE SCANLAN: The second proposed committee amendment is substantive. It is the one to which I adverted earlier, namely, the suggestion of Delegate Morgan that in the last line of Page 4, Section 7, of the proposed regulation, dealing with contingent compensation, the last line thereof, now reading "contingent upon such adoption or defeat," be eliminated, and that there be substituted for the language reading "that is determined" --
