9 THE PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question
10 arises on the motion that the Secretary take all reason-
11 able steps to cause the regulation just adopted be
12 published and to become known to those affected by it.
13 All those in favor, signify by saying Aye; contrary, No.
14 The Ayes have it. It is so ordered.
