THE PRESIDENT: I am sorry. 1 DELEGATE WHITE: I would like to have --2 THE PRESIDENT: Just a second, please. The 3 Chair was advised that copies of the substitute proposal 4 had been circulated. Am I in error on that? Mrs. Marx, 5 are there additional copies available? 6 Delegate White, you desire this in order to 7 vote on the pending motion? 8 DELEGATE WHITE: That is right, sir. 9 may be unnecessary for me to vote for sending it back 10 to the committee if we can make the distinction at this 11 time. 12 Delegate Scanlan, are you THE PRESIDENT: 13 sufficiently familiar with the proposed substitute to 14 summarize it very briefly? I do not want to have the 15 full discussion of the two proposals at this time. 16 DELEGATE SCANLAN: I have the same reluctance. 17 We would be entering upon a debate that may never occur, 18 or a debate that will/repeated again when the matter comes 19 back but as I understand it the primary difference 20 between the Clark Resolution and the proposal advocated

21
